"UNDER FULL STEAM"



On Lake George, New York there is a steamboat called the Minnie-Ha-Ha which steams around the southern part of the lake under paddle wheel power. The owners of the Lake George Steam Boat Company decided to add a steam power calliope like you would find in an old-fashioned circus. The calliope was placed on the stern on a platform that would face the dock where the people waited to board. The idea was that the music would entertain the people while they waited and serve as advertisement throughout Lake George Valley. The music would echo around the lake's basin as the boat moved out of the dock.

A good idea but there was a problem. The calliope took so much steam from the boiler to make its music that the paddle wheel would not turn - not enough steam to drive the pistons that moved the paddle wheel. The Minni-Ha-Ha was a real paddle wheel steamer. You could have music or movement but not both. The boiler had insufficient power. The result was that the calliope played while the Minni was docked but not when it was underway.

The church is a lot like a steam paddle wheeler. Our energy must be channeled into directions that will further the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ. Without the vision we might make a lot of noise, but we will not get anywhere. The scriptures say, "without vision the people die". Vision guides us, helps us set our priorities for what we need to be doing.

As we go into 2002 and the season of Lent, as we go forward in our life together as a new church in a new place, we consider our vision. What is our mission? In the simplest it is to present Jesus to our community as the means to salvation. Through worship, Christian Education, outreach projects, and fellowship we show the world that Jesus leads us to God. Jesus shows us the radical love of God that will forgive and wipe out sin. Jesus brings us the hope of God, that we can make a difference: make the world a better place.

There is a paradigm shift going on in the church from institutional maintenance to mission focus. Since sometime after World War II the Protestant church has been struggling to hold itself together, especially the Presbyterian Church. Many of our churches are in survival mode - what must we do to keep the doors open? Everything they do is dependent upon saving their church from closing. What they must do is have impossible dreams, move from institutional survival to mission focus centers where people put their faith into action with hands on projects. Today people want to be involved. They want to be close to the work that is done.

The Minni-Ha-Ha can move forward or play the calliope. It won't do both. If we worry about the institution but have no vision we will die. Let us embrace our vision, let us be a mission center where God's work is done.



CIRCLE OF THE TRINITY A NEW YEAR - A NEW BEGINNING



TOOLS OF HOPE AND BLANKET SUNDAY

February 10, 2002

Did you know that a \$5 blanket has a lot in common with something like a hoe or trowel – it's a small, simple, relatively inexpensive item, but for someone in need it's a gift that can make a world of difference!

It's a tradition here at Gardens for the kids to show and tell us why we should give to this worthy cause. And this year, they will be presenting a short skit to explain the new name of this Church World Service project and how your gift can help.

Our gifts make possible. . .

- Tools of hope such as blankets, tents, bedding and other emergency supplies in the wake of natural disasters as well as human calamities such as wars and ethnic violence.
- Drilling and installing a village well to bring safe clean water to villages in Haiti, in Malawi, and more than 20 countries worldwide.
- A hoe, shovel and rake for a rural family in Senegal, or 150 baby fish (fingerlings) to stock a village pond in the Bolivian Andes -- \$15 tools of hope to increase food production.
- A wire chicken coop and batch of chicks for enterprising women and their families in Ghana or the Dominican Republic -- \$75 tools of hope to gain a share in the local market economy.

Dear Friends:

The words and music of a song my choir is singing for Advent seem to keep playing in my mind, "say he will some, pray he will come to a sin sick world with his love . . . say he will come and bring peace to all who believe, chosen one . . ."

Advent is a re enactment of the depth of longing and desire for a Savior. The Hebrew people were looking for the one who would end the despair of slavery, the brutality of occupation, and bring prosperity and peace.

As a babe, Christ was born into a world that was dark, a world not unlike our world today. Yet as hope and love broke through the darkness with the birth of the Son, so too in many dark places the church breaks through with a message of love, a word of comfort, and physically binds wounds and builds hope where chaos seems the order of the day.

Through your support to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, you have become the arm of tenderness that covered the shoulder of a Presbyterian pastor during the renewal retreat held at Stony Point, New York following the events of September 11th.
