The Danish alphabet:

Danish is written using the Latin alphabet with three extra letters (vowels) placed at the end of the alphabet: \not E (\not E), \not O (\not O), and \not A (\not A). The corresponding double characters are: AE (ae), OE (oe), and AA (aa). The Danish alphabet therefore consists of 28 letters as W (w) is not part of it. \not E (AE) sounds like a in ache but very short. \not O (OE) is rather similar to German \vec{o} but the sound is shorter. It sounds like ir in bird but the sound is short and without the r and with lips more rounded. \vec{A} (AA) sounds like au in caught or like \vec{o} in old. Hints of pronunciation is taken from:

How to pronounce 'Søndergaard':

'Søndergaard' means 'south (sønder) farm (gaard)'. It is the name of the old family farm from the 1600's on the Danish island Mors.

- (1) The easiest way to pronounce it is to think of the word 'synagogue' or 'Senegal'. It almost has the same 'melody'.
- (2) Both 'd's are silent.
- (3) 'aa' is in this case the same as the letter 'a'.
