

Love Bug virus wreaks havoc

A virus spread by mail messages titled 'ILOVEUMNO' has caused havoc in Malaysia after crippling the brains of more than 2,000 people in Kuala Lumpur and threatening the intelligence of millions more in the country. deputy president for life and Hishammuddin Youth head for life. "That way, we can have more time during the Assembly to make droning speeches worshipping, idolizing and praising the party leadership."

Many of the motions tabled at the General Assembly by the delegates also reflected UMNO's strong stand on democracy. Among these were motions to fire civil servants who did not support UMNO; ban opposition newspapers; ban opposition parties; stop scholarships of students who did not support UMNO; recruit only civil servants who supported UMNO and award government projects and contracts only to UMNO supporters. "UMNO is clearly becoming more liberal, tolerant and open to criticism," the delegate mused. 'Frankly, I personally think all these Opposition trouble-makers should be blindfolded, handcuffed and beaten to a pulp by our Chief of Police. But that is not in our culture.'

Mahathir says he might retire ...again

Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad this month announced that he might retire by the year 2003 – the latest in a long, predictable series of announcements of his impending retirement. Mahathir had earlier promised that he would retire after the Commonwealth Games in 1998. He then announced that he would retire after the Asian economic crisis was over. He then announced that he would retire as soon as he found a suitable deputy Prime Minister. A political analyst who refused to be named said that it was evident the current rumours were unfounded. "Mahathir had said he'd kiss Anwar to prove there was no rift. With Daim, he only hugs him. The relationship has not reached kissing stage yet - this is a clear indication that Daim is still in favour."

Meanwhile, the Kuala Lumpur stock market reacted to Mahathir's denial by dipping 0.9 percentage points, as no one believed him.

Riot police disperse illegal assemblies

Just weeks after they were called to disperse illegal assemblies of Reformasi supporters commemorating last year's April 14th sentencing of Anwar Ibrahim, riot police were again called in to disperse illegal assemblies of UMNO delegates collecting big wads of cash to vote in this month's UMNO elections.

Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad this month complained that delegates were arriving early in Kuala Lumpur many days before the UMNO Elections were to begin, hoping to receive cash from candidates contesting for party posts. He ordered delegates to leave Kuala Lumpur.

'It was evident that the delegates ignored the 'go home' order and refused to disperse, so we had to take action,' said a senior FRU officer who refused to be named. Water cannon attacked five-star hotel lobbies,

discotheques and karaoke lounges across Kuala Lumpur, scattering wet delegates who left behind hundreds of unmarked brown envelopes full of hundred ringgit notes.

"The poor UMNO president has been crying his eyes out for the past three UMNO Elections telling these people not buy votes and they still keep on doing it," the officer said. "Stern action needed to be taken."

In a related development, hoteliers, karaoke lounge operators, disotheque owners and guest relations officers protested the 'go home' order, saying it was hurting business. "To prevent delegates from spending their hard-

earned bribes is a flagrant abuse of their human rights," said guest relations officer Fanny Kwan as an UMNO delegate slipped a fifty ringgit note down her cleavage.

Police recover missing person abducted from newspaper

Police this month revealed that they had identified the mysterious person who went missing from a newspaper article in the Nanyang Siang Pau. Readers were mystified when the newspaper published an article on the "Ten Worst Enemies of the Press" but proceeded to name only nine individuals. The article highlighted nine individuals who were named by the Committee to Protect Journalists, including world leaders such as Yugoslavia's Slobodan Milosevic, Iran's Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, Cuba's Fidel Castro and China's Jiang Zemin.

However, the tenth person was not named and was suspected missing. Suspecting foul play, readers lodged a missing persons report with police.

"We initially suspected that the tenth person was among the hostages kidnapped from Sipadan," said a police spokesman who refused to be

named. 'However, our investigations have revealed that the missing person is, in fact, safe and sound, and was last seen at the Putra World Trade Centre.'

So as not impede on-going investigations, he would not reveal the name of the missing tenth person, only hinting that the person is "a Prime Minister of Malaysia".

"We suspect that this is the work of foreigners jealous of our success who did not want yet another 'Malaysia Boleh' achievement highlighted to the world community," the spokesman speculated.

This is the second such incident involving missing persons from Chinese newspapers. Last year, Anwar Ibrahim went mysteriously missing from a picture of the UMNO leadership in the Sin Chew Jit Poh.



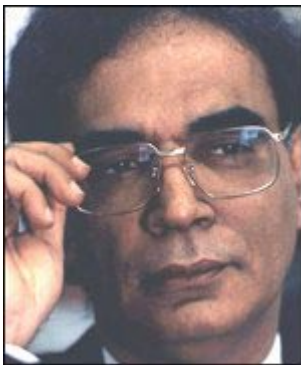

Police introduce innovative sex education programme

Police this month denied allegations of torture and cruelty, claiming that detainees were forced to perform sex shows for police guards as part of a new sex education programme for prisoners. The allegations emerged in the trial of Tenaganita director Irene Fernandez when witnesses testified that detainees were stripped naked and regularly forced to masturbate each other, perform oral sex and smear sperm on their faces while an audience of laughing and clapping policemen watched. Detainees who refused to perform the sexual acts were kicked and beaten, with one detainee dying from his wounds.

"We are disappointed that what we initiated as a useful sex education programme for detainees was misconstrued as torture and cruelty on our part," said a police spokesman who refused to be named. "We just wanted to highlight to prisoners the ills of masturbation and oral sex and the importance of moral values," he stressed as he pushed a Bangladeshi detainee's penis into a Burmese detainee's mouth. He added that the programme was painstakingly developed using techniques pioneered while extracting voluntary confessions from suspects in the Anwar Ibrahim police investigations.

He added that even UMNO was now conducting such education

programmes for its members. "In 1998, the Prime Minister himself taught Malaysians about how to masturbate and insert penises into anuses in televised press conferences to Malaysians. And just this month, he was describing to delegates at the UMNO General Assembly how homosexuals 'depan, belakang, kiri, kanan pun boleh.'"

It was self-inflicted, says Sansui supporter

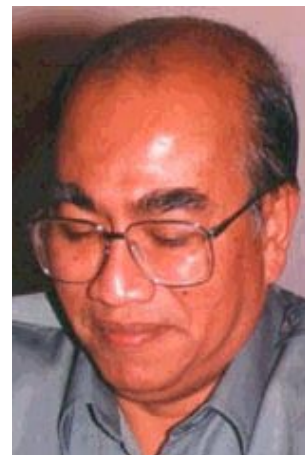
A supporter of Sanusi Junid said reports that two Malaysia Airlines staff were assaulted by the former Kedah Menteri Besar were slanderous lies and claimed that the wounds they suffered were actually self-inflicted. The supporter who refused to be named was commenting on the police report lodged by the MAS employees against Sanusi for allegedly slapping and kicking them at the KL International Airport this month.

"They were 'safe and sound' when Sanusi left the airport," the supporter claimed. "I have no doubt their wounds were self-inflicted. Either that, or

Sansui was provoked. I heard them call him a father of dogs just because he made some obscene hand gestures at them."

Police are investigating the assault and have called on the services of former police chief Rahim Noor to conduct an independent investigation.

From previous experience, even if convicted, it is not expected that Sanusi's jail term would exceed a couple of months.

UMNO committed to eradicating corruption

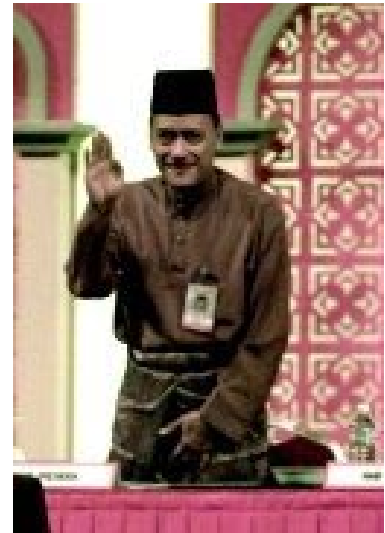
