The prevailing keen interest by the industry in applying technology to maximise the value of field developments, as witnessed by the size of the attendance at the last ATW on SMART well technology in Miri last year, has prompted the section to propose this ATW which has been accepted by the Regional SPE director. The event will also help to promote Brunei as a tourism destination in the spirit of VBY2001. The Theme of this year's ATW is 'Optimising Field Development using Novel completion and SMART well technologies'. Members in Brunei are encouraged to give their support with quality contributions as it is anticipated that there will be keen interest from regional and international participation.
