1.1 Development Workstations

EIS managers and administrators maintain the development workstations. The minimum characteristics and capacity of these workstations are the same as for the client workstations.



1.2 Wide Area Network (WAN)

Each workstation communicates with the EIS Database Server over a WAN. This WAN is a private network administered by Teale Data Center (TDC) dedicated to data communication between the DRE Sacramento staff and headquarters and district offices in Oakland, Los Angeles, San Diego, and Fresno.

TDC provides connectivity between DRE offices, to the Oracle relational database, and access to Internet services, over a statewide WAN utilizing TDC's California State Government Network (CSGNet). DRE's Sacramento, Los Angeles, and Oakland offices are connected to CSGNet through T1 lines. The San Diego and Fresno offices are connected through 56KB lines.



1.3 Unix Database Server

The Unix Database Server is a Sun Enterprise 5500. This system is configured as follows:





2. ¹EIS System Setup

2.1 NT-Workstations (Client and Development)

DRE staff use Windows NT workstations to access the New EIS. These workstations are connected to the local area Windows NT network and to the Oracle database using Oracle Net (SQL*Net).

There are some common applications associated with running the EIS system on both workstation types. This section discusses the setup and configuration of the NT workstations, and will cover installation of the EIS executable, registry changes, Oracle Net, Crystal Reports, MS Word, and the EIS Security Application.

3.1.1 Oracle Net Installation on Client And Development Workstations

- 1. Complete a full install of Oracle Net8.
 - a) Go to Path: D\Orant\Net80\Admin\Tnsnames.ora.
 - b) Open the Tnsnames.ora file and define the DREPRD.WORLD parameters.
