

15th Romsey (North Baddesley) Scout Group serves the North Baddesley Area. Membership is available for boys aged between 6 years and 18 years and girls aged between 10½ and 18 years. The Group is run entirely by volunteers.

Our Headquarters is in the Car Park at Mountbatten Park. This is accessed from Queens Ride which is off Ringwood Drive, almost opposite to Hollywood Close. (There is a post box opposite the turning and a Scout sign on the Queen's Ride road nameplate)

The Group is divided into four youth sections:-

**Beaver Scouts** Age Range 6yrs - 8yrs Meet Tuesdays 17.45-19.00 hrs

Beavers belong to the Beaver *Colony*, with the boys split into "Lodges" Learning is developed on the basis of having fun and making friends

**Badges:** There are three "challenge badges" called Discovery, Friendship and Outdoor encouraging the Beavers to undertake a balanced programme of fun and adventure following each of those themes.

In addition there are 5 Activity Badges (Animal Friend, Creative, Experiment, Explore and Faith). The top award for Beaver's will be the Chief Scout's Bronze Award.

Cubs belong to the Cub Pack with the boys split into 4

"Sixes". The Cubs start developing ideas of responsibility and self reliance through a ranger of indoor and outdoor activities.

**Badges:** For the Cubs, there are five Challenge Badges (Caring, Creative, Fitness, Global and Outdoor) and 32 "Activity Badges" (replacing the old Proficiency Badges) The top award is the Chief Scout's Silver Award

Scouts belong to the Scout Troop with the youngsters split

Scouts belong to the Scout *Troop* with the youngsters split into Patrols. The Patrol is a vital part of the Troop, with many of the activities planned and carried out in the Patrol. The Patrol is led by a Patrol Leader who represents the members of his Patrol at the "Patrol Leaders Forum". This helps develop a sense of responsibility within the individuals, and an appreciation for the needs of others,

**Training:** In Scouts there are eight Challenge Badges (Adventure, Community, Creative, Expedition, Fitness, Global, Outdoor and Outdoor Plus) and 72 Activity Badges. The top Award is the Chief Scout's Gold Award

**Explorer Scouts** Age Range 14-18 yrs Meet Thursdays 20:00 - 21.30 hrs

Explorer Scouts offer the Members a wide range of activities and experiences through an integrated programme run by Romsey District. We have our own unit affiliated to the Group that undertake their own

activities as well as joining in the District Programme.

**Training:** The members are encouraged to complete the Duke of Edinburgh Awards - but there are also 14 Activity Badges for the Explorer Scouts. There are three "top awards" - Chief Scout's Platinum Award, Chief Scout's Diamond Award and the Queen's Scout Award.

# **Subscriptions:** (As from 1st Sept 2007)

Current subscriptions are £22 per term, payable at the start of each term. A £2 discount (ie £20) is given if subs are paid by the second week of term.

We do not usually issue receipts where subs are paid by cheque. Please ask if you require one.

These cover weekly running costs, badges and annual fees and insurance to District, County & Headquarters.

Camps and other activities are charged separately at cost.

Members of the Group are asked to help deliver the parish magazine "Baddesley Beadle" each quarter to assist with fund-raising and to help the Community.

The Group Supporters raise additional funds when needed to maintain the Scout HQ, and Camping Equipment etc. Help from parents is always welcomed - and is vital for the survival of the Group.

# **Training Programme:**

Each Section has its own training programme which helps the members develop as they grow. by teaching them self-reliance, and consideration for others whilst allowing them to develop their own individual skills through a variety of "activity badges". Much of Scouting is based on outdoor pursuits because this is seen as encouraging a healthy lifestyle, but there is still room for many indoor pursuits.

The Scout Shop, (upstairs in "Outdoors" East Street, Southampton) sells books which give further details, but these can usually be borrowed from the Group for short periods.

## "Patrol" System:

Scouting is founded on the basis of the members working in teams - helping them to develop a sense of fair-play as well as a responsibility for fellow members. These teams are known by different names within each section, and the degree of responsibility given to the members is increased as they move up through the sections

In addition all members and their families are invited to attend the District Carol Service held one evening shortly before Christmas at the United Reformed Church in Romsey, this is not a formal parade.

## Criminal Record Bureau (CRB) Disclosure Application Forms

The Scout Group is run entirely by volunteers, and great care is taken not to put the members at risk. Parents will be asked to help from time to time, with activities or transport. In order that we can safeguard the young members we ask that parents who help in any capacity, complete "CRB Forms"

A Leader or Group Administrator will ask you to complete the form. You will need to provide your National Insurance No and prove of identity by reference to a Passport, Driving license, Birth/Marriage Certificate etc. The form is quite complex and a separate instruction sheet will be provided to help you complete the form. Please return it as soon as possible as it can take several months for clearance to reach us.

The Scout Association can then carry out a confidential enquiry into your background. If you are concerned about this, I can give you more details of what this involves.

## Data Protection Act Approval Form

It is necessary for us to keep records about the individuals that belong to the Group in order to monitor progress and to ensure the well being of all members. Some data is kept on computer, but medical, dietary, religious and special needs information is not. We ask that you sign the enclosed form to allow us to keep such records.

# Gift Aid Declaration

If you pay income tax we are able to claim back the tax you have already paid on your child's subscriptions. There is no extra cost to you, but this enables us to keep subscriptions to a minimum. Please sign and return this form promptly. The Group can gain about £600 each year from this process.
