

CINDERELLA LAY-UP

Fridge & Food Stuff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - turn thermostat to OFF and close fridge 12v breaker - empty and clean (water/vinegar) fridge - leave fridge plug open, and leave fridge door ajar for air circulation - throw away all perishables - all canned goods and unopened goods in glass OK under settee - all spices, food stuff in plastic containers (flour, pasta, etc.) can stay but store under settee away from sun - all liquor can stay, make sure bottles are well closed - take out "all" garbage
Clothes & Linen	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - everything that stays must be clean and dry - store everything in bags (garbage bags, etc.) with plenty of Bounty sheets, remove air from bag and tie or tape shut. Label bag with contents - wetsuits, jackets, safety jackets, snorkel gear, etc. must all be rinsed in fresh water, dried and stored in ventilated areas (i.e. hang them up in lockers)
Inside space	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - clean all floors and plastic walls (heads, main cabin) with water/vinegar - optionally, clean bilges, and textured walls with water/bleach (needed once/year) - put roach traps in key areas (under settee) - put de-humidifiers in hulls (and/or main cabin) - put all mattresses in vertical positions (for ventilation)
Heads	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - clean heads and flush completely (25 strokes minimum) - close head seacocks - check hoses and clamps
Water System	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - turn off water pump 12v breaker - run water until pressure removed - no need to fill water tanks

Electronic	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - remove all portable electronics (VHF...) and store in cabin (with desiccant in sealed container ???) - put covers on all electronic equipment - check all equipment with batteries, replace batteries once per year, or leave equipment with no batteries (Garmin, flashlights, portable VHF,
Dinghy & outboard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - clean dinghy, remove all loose stuff - open water plug - leave dinghy on davits but on a slant so rainwater runs out and engine out of water - tie dinghy to boat so it doesn't swing around too much - fill fuel tank (to avoid condensation) but not to top - close fuel valve on outboard - leave air vent slightly open - lock dinghy and motor to boat (davits)
Outside	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - close both propane tanks - empty (if possible) fuel containers (gaz and diesel), leave air valve open and store in anchor locker - remove all loose equipment, rinse with fresh water, dry and store inside (lifesling, fishing rod, winch handles, boat brush, cushions, - inspect, lubricate and close all hatches (use vaseline on seal once per 6 months, ?? on hinges) including emergency hatches
Sails	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - ensure mainsail cover closed, roller furler sheets locked and wrapped around genoa - for summer, wrap extra line around mainsail cover and rolled genoa for protection against high winds
Bimini	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - ensure opening well closed and bimini tight all the way around
Dock Lines & Fenders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - install lines in X fore, aft, starboard and port as required - install chaffe protection for all suspect areas - install fenders in required areas - check over several tide swings and make adjustments

Electrical	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - charge batteries to 100% - turn off all breakers at 12v breaker panel - turn off all battery breakers at battery breaker panel - leave solar panels ON
Engines	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Run engines to charge batteries 100% - check all fluids (engine oil, transmission oil, coolant), leave engine oil at ½ to leave room for top-off - fill fuel tank to maximum (to avoid condensation) - check all belts, hoses and clamps (especially raw water hoses) - close engine starter circuits at battery breaker panel - close raw water seacocks of both engines
