

Midnight Sun Chapter honors member

On April 29, the Midnight Sun 99s gathered to honor one of our cherished members.

At the home of Connie Cloud, our oldest member (and probably the oldest 99 in Alaska), Pearl Laska Chamberlain, was presented with a stunning quilt made by Phyllis Tate and Connie Could in commemoration of her 96th birthday. Pearl is an extraordinary woman who continued flying until well into her 8os!

When Pearl began talking about moving to Tennessee to live with her son, we knew we had to do something special. A quilt, filled with Alaska and aviation pictures, was the answer. A hand-made quilt, supported by heart-felt words, speaks loudly of the camaraderie and friendship she found while flying in this great land.

A dark blue fabric with small gold stars (representing our state flag) was sewn together in the shape of Alaska, and the border was laced with pictures of Pearl dating back to her first solo (in a long straight skirt, no less!) in
