Second, Alumnae Chapter expenses for Convention will be split equally between the chapter and International. Third, nomination and election procedures for Executive Board positions have changed. Notably, no nominations will be accepted from the floor during Convention 2007. In addition, a board of Nominating Trustees will be created to select candidates for the final ballot. The plan is for the board to consist of a Past International President, a Ritual expert, an Alumnae Chapter President, a Chapter Adviser and a Member at Large.
