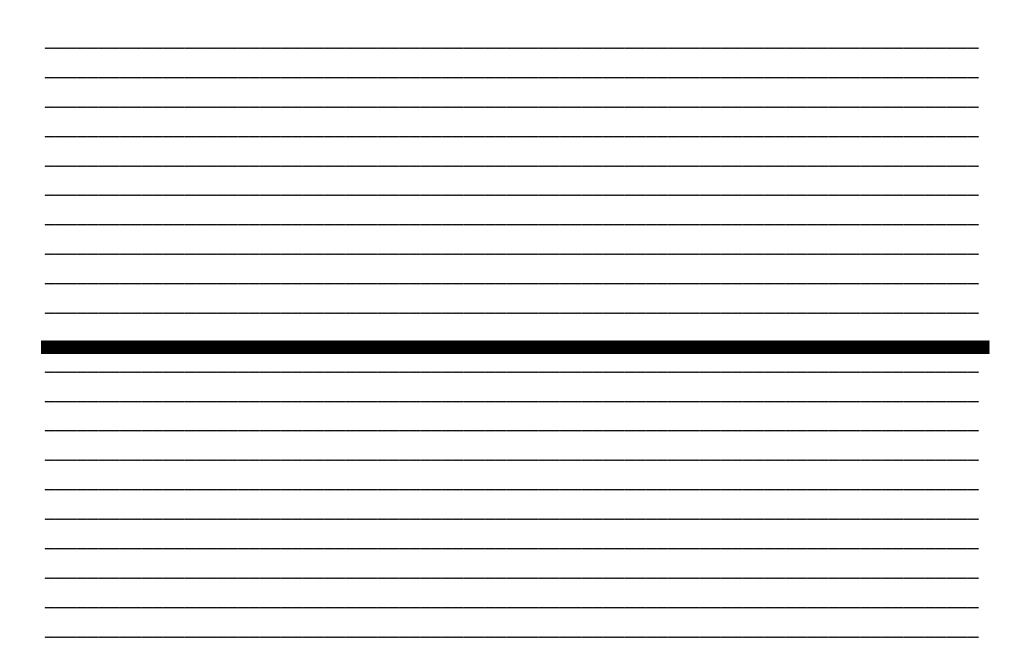
The first page in this selection is the main timeline page that can be copied on different color card stock for a note-book timeline. The following pages are date labels that can be cut out and pasted on the center line of the page. There are a few for each century to allow the student to create however many of a certain timeframe that they may need. If you tape the cardstock pages on the ends forming an accordion style timeline, you can look at the timeline in two fashions. You can flip pages in your notebook, or you can stretch out the timeline for use when you need it. This is the idea suggested by Amy Pak whose timeline characters are wonderful! We use them in our notebooks. They are black and white drawings which allows the student to color the pictures. They have information text accompanying the graphic. It makes for an adorable book that the students enjoy.

We also use other clipart and pictures as we desire, but Amy's work is so thorough that we often need not go far to find the character or event we are looking for to complete our studies.
