

Life at the Ohio Department of Transportation

Let's see. Where should I start? First, I'll apologize if this article bores you to death. I would love to write a book about my time as an engineer thus far, but I don't have time for that, so I'll just try to give you a basic idea of what I do. I work for the Ohio Department of Transportation District 7. District 7's headquarters is in the booming metropolis of Sidnev (a town almost as nonexistent as Ada, except that we at least have a Wal-Mart). My district is responsible for all state routes and interstates in nine counties, including Interstate 75 though Dayton.

I work in the production department at our district headquarters. The production department is responsible for design, contracts, real estate purchase and surveying. We also handle review for plans done by consultants. I work in design on a crew that consists of two engineers and four transportation technicians. My current project includes pave-

ment widening and ditch realignment as well as a culvert extension. My next projects include another pavement widening, a pavement resurfacing project on I75, and an interchange design for two state routes. Although some people in design specialize in certain areas such as bridge or traffic design, we all work on a variety of projects. Eventually, my specialty will be pavement design.

During my time at ODOT, I have discovered that working in design requires a lot of time spent at a computer. Fortunately, the men with whom I work love to joke around and make the office a very entertaining place. One benefit of working in design is that I have
