ONU Greek News



The university hopes to start construction on a Greek Village as soon as next summer. As you may or may not know, a Greek alumni meeting was held in October as part of Homecoming weekend. As an opening to the meeting, Bill Robinson stated that the "administration desired to see the Greek community succeed, even though rumors saying otherwise continue to be said."

The main point on the agenda was to update alumni on the proposed Greek village. The village is to be university owned and operated, which is anticipated to be cheaper than the current situations for Chapters to build their own houses. The university will be working closely with the Greek community to design and implement the village. The intent of this project is the help revitalize the Greek Community.

The size and number of bedrooms per house is yet to be determined and will be flexible to each Chapter's needs. The cost is anticipated to be comparable to the residence halls and on campus apartments. The new houses will not be dry, and the current alcohol and risk management policies will govern the village.

Chapters will not be forced to comply with the plan and can make their own decision whether to be a part of the Greek village.

Alumni are being asked to assist the active chapters with their decision concerning Greek Village. Some of the things suggested are to be sure that younger members are included in the decision making, since they will likely be the ones to see the construction of Greek village and that the Chapter consider the needs and wants of future members.

Adriane Thompson-Bradshaw, Dean of Students, and Peter Kiefor, Graduate Intern, are currently assisting the office of Greek Life. A search is in progress to hire a full-time Director of Greek and Student Activities.

The university is also hoping to form a Greek alumni council, which will connect the Greek alumni to the university and the current Greek community as well as sponsor special programs for Greek alums.


Erica Fouss
