

We recommend that you make reservations early because Shreveport/Bossier City is a Casino gambling community and motel space is at a premium. Although the Shreveport motels are further from the show site, they are generally lower in price than the Bossier City motels. Some dog weight limits may be in affect. Note: I-20 construction west of Shreveport is causing some major traffic delays. Red Roof Inn in Greenwood is located close to the west entry of the I-220 loop. Acceptance of dogs policies are subject to change, so please inquire when making reservations. There are a number of new motels and change of ownership regarding existing motels. You are encouraged to check out Shreveport/Bossier City websites for additional lodging information.

ENTRIES AND CLOSING DATES

Entries must be received by **7 p.m. February 27, 2004.** Entry modifications due to *advancement to a higher class* only will be received until noon March 8, 2004, but the original entry must be received by February 27, 2004. <u>No cancellations, additions, refund requests or other changes to entries shall be permitted after the initial closing date of February 27, 2004.</u>

Telephone, faxed or e-mailed entries without appropriate fees cannot be accepted. All entries must be in writing and either mailed or presented in person, with appropriate fees, to Patt Elmore, Test Secretary, before the initial closing date. Changes for advancement to a higher class must also be in writing, either mailed, faxed, e-mailed or presented in person to Patt Elmore by the secondary closing of March 8, 2004. All changes for advancement to a higher class must be received no later than noon March 8, 2004. Pawprints will not be held liable for delays in mail, e-mail or receipt of faxed information.

IMPORTANT. If you send an entry by overnight mail, you <u>must</u> sign the waiver allowing delivery without signature. There will be no one available to sign for packages and Pawprints will not be responsible for entries delayed in delivery. Pawprints reserves the right to refuse entries received after the closing date due to not signing the signature waiver.

CHECK IN

Check in will begin at **11 a.m.**, Friday, March 12, 2004. Saturday, March 13, 2004 and Sunday, March 14, 2004 check in will begin at **7:30 a.m.** There will be no early check in for this trial. Handlers need only check in dogs their first day of competition. Dogs requiring measurement should arrive early. **All competitors should have their measurement cards with them at check-in so that registration numbers can be verified.** All dogs must be registered with USDAA in order to compete in USDAA sanctioned events. Additionally, all junior handlers must be separately registered with their dogs for participation in Championship/Performance classes. A registration form may be obtained from USDAA, or registration may be made concurrently with entry to this show, a form for which is included in this Agility Test Schedule. **Testing will begin at Noon (12:00 p.m.) on Friday and at 8:00 a.m. Saturday and Sunday.**

PRIZES AND AWARDS

STANDARD CLASSES: Strip ribbons for First through Fourth place in each jump height. NON-STANDARD CLASSES: Gamblers, Snooker and Jumpers--Strip ribbons for First through Fourth place in each jump height. Pairs -- Strip ribbons for First through Fourth each team member in mini and open.

CHAMPIONSHIP GRAND PRIX OF DOG AGILITY QUALIFIER: Rosettes for First through Fourth place in 12" jump height, for First through Eighth place in 16" jump height, for First through Eighth place in 22" jump height, and for First through Sixth place in 26" jump height. Dogs with qualifying scores shall receive a maroon and white qualifying ribbon.

PERFORMANCE GRAND PRIX OF DOG AGILITY QUALIFIER: Rosettes for First through Third place in each jump height. Dogs with qualifying scores shall receive a maroon and pink qualifying ribbon.

STEEPLECHASE QUALIFIER: Handlers competing in Round 2 will compete for prize money totaling 40% of the entry fee for the class. See Steeplechase Qualifier information in this test schedule for breakdown in percentages.

No awards will be mailed; they must be claimed by the participant or their representative on the day of the competition.

AGILITY OBSTACLES

Obstacles shall be chosen from those described in the current edition of the official Rules and Regulations of the United States Dog Agility Association, Inc., and shall meet the requirements therein.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS (Effective January 1, 2004)

Two certification programs will be offered at this event – Championship & Performance. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance Program classes for which they are eligible. Classes include standard agility, gamblers, jumpers, pairs relay and snooker agility as set forth in Chapters 3 – 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations, each of which are conducted at three competitive levels.

Under NO circumstance may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class at this event. (Example: Standard in both Championship and Performance)

CHAMPIONSHIP DOG AGILITY PROGRAM

The <u>Starters level</u> classes shall be for dogs that have not earned the *Agility Dog*® title or a title in the standard AND all of the nonstandard classes. <u>Starters</u> classes are for dogs handled by a person who has not previously earned the *Agility Dog* title or a title in the Performance or Veterans Program with any dog. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Agility Dog* title. **Novice level dogs may compete in Starters class at this trial.**

The <u>Advanced level</u> classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Agility Dog*[®] title or that have earned three qualifying scores in Starters level standard or nonstandard classes, with scores being earned from two different judges (and with three different partners in pairs relay), shall be eligible for entry into the Advanced level standard or corresponding nonstandard classes without having earned the *Agility Dog*[®] title. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Advanced Agility Dog* title.

The <u>Masters level</u> classes shall be for dogs that have earned the <u>Advanced Agility Dog®</u> title or that have received three qualifying scores in Advanced level standard or corresponding nonstandard class, with scores being earned from two different judges (and with three different partners in pairs relay), shall be eligible for entry into the Masters level standard or nonstandard class without having earned the <u>Advanced Agility Dog®</u> title.

Performance Program Classes

Generally, Performance Level I, Level II and Level III are run on courses used for Starters, Advanced and Masters classes in the Championship Program, with the following exceptions: the Aframe is set at 5'6", jump heights are one height class lower as set forth in Notes to Competitors, no spread hurdles are utilized and time standards in the standard, jumpers classes are extended by 3 seconds beyond that utilized in the Championship Program and the pairs relay class is non-qualifying. Eligibility is determined as follows:

The <u>Performance I</u> classes shall be for any dog that has not earned the <u>Performance Dog</u> \hat{l}^{SM} title or a title in the standard AND all of the nonstandard classes. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes (i.e., Snooker, Jumpers and Gamblers) is required to earn the <u>Performance Dog</u> \hat{l}^{SM} title.

The <u>Performance II</u> classes shall be for any dog that has earned the <u>Performance Dog ISM</u> title, the <u>Veteran Agility Dog ISM</u> title, or has received three qualifying scores in a Level I standard or corresponding nonstandard class with scores being earned from two different judges shall be eligible for entry into Level II standard or nonstandard classes without having earned the <u>Performance Dog ISM</u> title. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the <u>Performance Dog ISM</u> title.

The <u>Performance III</u> classes shall be for any dog that has earned the *Performance Dog II*SM title, the *Advanced Agility Dog*SM title, the *Veteran Advanced Agility Dog*SM title or has received three qualifying scores from two different judges, in either (1) three qualifying scores in Level II standard or nonstandard classes, (2) three qualifying scores in Advanced level standard or nonstandard classes, or (3) three qualifying scores in Veterans level standard or nonstandard classes is eligible for entry in the level III standard or corresponding nonstandard class.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS (Effective January 1, 2004) - cont

NONSTANDARD CLASSES

<u>Gamblers Class</u>: Consists of an opening sequence of point collection by successfully completing obstacles in a pattern chosen by the handler, and a "gamble" which is a sequence designated by the judge to be handled from a distance. This class shall be scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of the USDAA® Rules and Regulations.

<u>Jumpers Class</u>: Consists of a course of jumps and may include a tire and tunnels. This class shall be scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of the USDAA® Rules and Regulations. <u>Snooker Class</u>: Consists of an opening sequence of point collection by successfully completing obstacles in a red color pattern and a closing sequence of a set pattern. This class shall be scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of the USDAA® Rules and Regulations.

<u>Pairs Relay</u>: Consists of a standard course with one dog and handler doing a portion of the course, followed by a baton exchange to a second handler and dog who do the second portion of the course. Both dogs must be from the same height division (open or mini). This class shall be scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of the USDAA® Rules and Regulations.

<u>Open Performance Pairs Relay</u>: Open to all dogs entered in all Performance levels. Both dogs do **not** have to be from the same height division (open/mini). Class will be run on an **Advanced** -style course scored under Starters rules.


DIRECTIONS TO THE TEST SITE

From I-20 West (Texas): Go east on I-20, through Shreveport/Bossier City. Take Exit #26 (I-220 Racetrack). Take Exit 17A (79/80). Go left on North79/East 80. Get in the right hand lane. Travel 1.3 miles. Go through one set of stop lights and a caution light. At the next stop light, turn right on Bodcau Station. (Note: McDonald's is on the left. The road on the left reads Bellevue, but the road on the right is Bodcau Station. Follow the curving asphalt road through a residential area, approximately 1.1 miles. Next, you will go past a large mobile home community on your left. Further down the road, there will be a River Point sign to your right. Turn right at the sign and descend to the test site. You will see a practice horse racing track on your left and a small lake on your right. Facility is the second building on the left at the bottom of the hill.

From I-220 West (Texas): Go east on I-220, past Shreveport/Bossier City. Take Exit 17A (79/80 Racetrack) and follow above directions from there.

From I-20 East (Mississippi and Monroe): Go west on 1-20 to exit 26 (I220 By-Pass). Take Exit 17A (79/80) and follow above directions from there.

From I-49 South (Southern Louisiana): Take I-49 north to I-20. Go east on I-20 and follow above directions.



NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Competitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA rules and regulations, as amended January 1, 2004, which are hereby incorporated by reference, including but not limited to the following rules and conditions for submission and acceptance of entry:

- This test is open to all dogs at least eighteen months of age, including purebred and non-purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness that might affect the dog's physical or mental performance, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression.
- All dogs must be registered with USDAA in order to compete in USDAA sanctioned events. Registration may be made concurrently with entry to this show, a form for which is included in this agility test schedule.
- No leads, collars, food, toys or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time, except as provided in the USDAA rules and regulations.
- > Safety shall always be of foremost consideration at all times. Handlers through entry at this event accept full responsibility for themselves and the actions of their dogs.
- The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee view that participation by competitor or dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for their decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee.
- Fault limits may be imposed in any class at the discretion of the organizing committee.
- Competition is being held in a covered arena, on a packed dirt surface. Bathrooms are adjacent to the show site.
- Crating area will be provided adjacent to the test site. The area is open and covered in places. Spectator seating area is limited.
- Crates may be left at the site on Friday and Saturday night, but all live animals must be removed from the premises. The site can not be locked, so entrants are responsible for securing any valuables. Pawprints will not be liable for any loss due to theft, natural disasters, vandalism and Acts of God.
- Please observe any posted or verbal regulations regarding parking and set up. Several of the buildings on the premises are not owned by the arena owners and are OFF LIMITS to test participants. This area is also an active horse training facility and dogs MUST be kept away from the horses. If you have questions, ask a Pawprints representative.
- DOGS MUST REMAIN ON LEASH AT ALL TIMES, except when competing in the ring or at the practice jump area. You must clean up after your dogs.
- > It is the responsibility of the competitor to have his/her dog ready to compete and at the ring entrance when the steward calls.
- ➤ Handlers and dogs should be familiar with USDAA® Equipment. There will be **no warm-up** period before testing begins.
- No entry fee will be refunded if the test cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, Act of God (including weather that the Organizing Committee in its sole determination shall deem unsafe), public emergency, act of a public enemy, strike or any other cause beyond the control of the organizers.
- ➤ It is the entrants responsibility to check for errors before submitting entry forms to this club. No entry will be refunded in the event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date.
- Returned checks do no constitute a valid entry. There will be a \$25.00 service charge for returned checks. Payment of entry fees and service charges shall be made in cash or money order within 30 days of postmark of notice of returned check where notification is received after event date. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice will result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration number(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is canceled without recourse by owner/handler.
- Amounts overpaid on entry fees of \$10.00 or less shall not be refunded.
- Pawprints will offer a prize raffle on Saturday during this trial.
- All Competitors through entry at this event waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast of this event. Competitors shall have the right to videotape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial or other purposes. All video, broadcast and telecast rights for this event are the exclusive property of United States Dog Agility Association, Inc.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS - cont.

2004 USDAA® Grand Prix of Dog Agility® Local Qualifier Class Description

This class is open to all dogs regardless of title or skill level - a single-round tournament featuring the sport in its basic form. The course includes an A-frame (set at 5'6" for the 12" and 16" height class), dog walk, see-saw, pipe tunnel, collapsed tunnel, weave poles, tire jump and a variety of other jumps and hurdles. Scoring follows regulations for standard scoring under Masters rules, except that time standards may generally range from 3.50 yards per second to 3.75 yards per second for dogs competing in the 22" and 26" height classes and from 2.85 to 3.00 yards per second in the 12" height class and from 3.10 to 3.40 yards per second for dogs competing in the 16" height class. Dogs that earn seven (7) or fewer faults shall earn a qualifying score and shall qualify to enter one of the Regional Championship events. Two (2) qualifying rounds (one of which may be earned at a Regional Championship) are required for entry to the World Championship quarterfinals. A complete copy of the 2004 tournament rules, which are hereby incorporated by reference, will be posted at the event, or may be obtained directly from USDAA.

2004 USDAA® Performance Grand Prix of Dog Agility® Local Qualifier Class Description

This class is open to all dogs regardless of title or skill level - a single-round tournament featuring the sport in its basic form. The course includes an A-frame, dog walk, seesaw, pipe tunnel, collapsed tunnel, weave poles, tire jump and a variety of other jumps and hurdles with adjustment for Performance Program standards as outlined in Chapter 7. Scoring follows regulations for standard scoring under Masters rules with three (3) seconds being added to the SCT for each jump height as determined for the Championship Grand Prix. Dogs that earn seven (7) or fewer faults shall earn a qualifying score and shall qualify to enter one of the Regional Championship events. Two (2) qualifying rounds (one of which may be earned at a Regional Championship) are required for entry to the World Championship quarterfinals. A complete copy of the 2004 tournament rules, which are hereby incorporated by reference, will be posted at the event, or may be obtained directly from USDAA

2004 Dog Agility Steeplechase® Local Qualifier

This tournament is open to ALL DOGS, regardless of past accomplishments. Scoring shall be on a time plus faults basis with a five-point penalty for each occurrence of a fallen hurdle and/or missed contact, with running the wrong course scored as an elimination as determined under Masters level rules. No refusals or missed weave poles shall be penalized, however, all obstacles must be completed before continuing on the remainder of the course.

The Steeplechase is a two-round tournament with emphasis on speed. Each round will be conducted on jumpers-style courses of different designs, with an A-frame and weave poles, either of which will be required to be performed twice. At a local qualifier the top 25% (minimum 4-12"/6-16"/8-22"/8-26", maximum 16 in each height) of dogs entered in each height in Round 1 shall advance to Round 2 at this qualifier to compete for prize money. Dogs scoring an elimination in Round 1 are not eligible to advance to Round 2 to satisfy the minimum/maximum requirements based on percentage. Dogs in the top 25% in excess of the maximum allowed to run in Round 2 will qualify for the Dog Agility Steeplechase® Championships Event to be held in the fall.

2004 Dog Agility Steeplechase® Local Qualifier - cont.

Prize money shall be computed based upon 40% of the total entry fees for the tournament class for all jump heights collectively, or such greater amount that a host organization designates for such purpose. Such money shall be distributed among eligible finalists in accordance with prize allocation table available at the event. Allocable prize money to finalist positions that are not filled for any reason shall be forfeited.

Please keep your dogs on leash when not in the ring. This is an active thoroughbred horse training/boarding facility and these big fellows spook easily. Keep dogs away from the horses, barns, track and stalls. Potty/exercise in designated areas.

Concessions may be available. Competitors are welcome to bring food and drink of their own.

All volunteer help at the trial is gratefully accepted.
