LOBBY DAY FOR EQUALITY

Lobby Day registration open – Wednesday, May 14 will be one of the most power-filled days for Ohioans who want equal rights for LGBT people and families. Last year HUNDREDS of Ohioans visited their elected officials to talk with them about equal rights for ALL Ohioans regardless of sexual orientation and gender identity. Mothers, fathers, families, clergy members, students—they took a day off from school or work to come to Columbus for the second annual Lobby Day. Lobby Day always makes an impact, but this year happens to be an election year. It's an even bigger deal to make sure our voices are heard. Have you been waiting to get involved? Now is the time. You have a powerful story to tell and your elected leader should hear it. It could make the difference. Lobby Day is your chance to build bridges and meet face-to-face with the men and women who shape state laws that impact our lives and our families. Equality Ohio's first Lobby Day last year was a tremendous success. Overwhelmingly, last year's participants reported they felt well-prepared and that their participation made a real difference.

AND THE OSCAR GOES TO

"Freeheld" won the Academy Award for best documentary short subject this year. "So what's the big deal? Never heard of it." I hear you say. The 38-minute documentary chronicles the experiences of an Ocean County prosecutor's investigator, Detective Lt. Laurel Hester, who died of lung cancer in February 2006 at 49. She fought her illness while battling the Ocean County freeholders for benefits for her partner, Stacie Andree.

At one point the documentary shows Lieutenant Hester in a wheelchair at a freeholders' meeting to ask that her pension be transferred to her partner. The five Ocean County freeholders ultimately voted to extend benefits to same-sex couples.

In 2006, New Jersey Gov. Jon Corzine signed legislation extending benefits to same-sex couples under a civil union law. However, Steven Goldstein, president of Garden State Equality, says that more than 2,400 couples in the state have entered into same-sex unions, and about one-fourth of them have filed complaints with Garden State Equality over benefits. He also commented, "Our civil union law is failing; it is not respected like marriage."

FEBRUARY MEETING

During the Lima PFLAG meeting in February, Forrest encouraged all members to attend the drag show in Ada at Ohio Northern University next year since it was a great time this year. Eight members of Lima PFLAG attended and all had a super time. The members even had seats very close to the stage courtesy of the Open Doors Group - thank you.

Kerry reported that he is still working with Jason and DeMarco (a gay Christian rock/contemporary singing duo) and trying to get them to come to Lima. When they performed in Dayton last year, a few members of Lima PFLAG saw them and they were excellent. It would be great to have them come to Lima!!

The speakers for the night were from Lima/Allen Council on Community Affairs. Judy Luhn began by talking about The Partnership for Violence Free Families (PVFF). The Partnership is a group comprised of 50 individuals representing over 30 agencies, organizations, businesses and schools in the Lima and Allen County, Ohio area. It is located at Lima/Allen Council on Community Affairs (LACCA) and was created in 2001 through a grant awarded by the Anthem Foundation of Ohio. After two years of strategic planning, the PVFF set their goals to prevent family violence through several initiatives: the ACT Against Violence Program, the CAP Program, Olweus Bullying Prevention Program, and Safe DATES.

Parents, teachers, and students participate in a variety of activities to understand these important messages. The faith-based community is also involved in bringing these programs to the community. A report from this partnership was passed out to all members. Judy stated our area is rich in resources and it is important to make the public aware of what is available. Donna Dickman next presented information about bullying. She stated bullying is very under reported. It happens in the school as well as work setting. In the work setting, there is high productivity but also a high turnover rate when the boss is a bully. Donna finds it important to look at kids who are bullies and why they are bullies. It is often a power/control issue. If they are helped as kids, they will not be bullies as adults.

Through an 8 question test from Olweus Bullying Prevention Program, Donna presented information about bullying such as the number of children bullied, how they are bullied, where they are bullied, and how often bullying is reported in the schools. She also presented information from GLSEN and Lambda Legal about GLBTQ youths who are bullied in the school setting.
