### Masonic Education



#### Brethren;

My topic this month is Benevolence and Charity which are basic principles of Freemasonry. Every mason is expected to maintain an attitude of benevolence towards all mankind and to perform acts of charity for those in need.

We come to Masonry as an individual and become part of a fraternity where we are surrounded by the love and affection of our brethren. Masonic benevolence is not just about financial assistance for fellow masons and their families. Every mason through his lodge or his private efforts needs to consider what he should, can and will do to assist others.

We both, as masons and individuals, have the opportunity to practice benevolence every day in some form. Benevolence can be as simple as saying good morning, holding a door for someone or tossing a loony into the boot at a lodge meeting. It can be something more involved such as hospital visitation, checking up on someone who lives alone or providing transportation when needed to someone without a vehicle. It also can be being aware of an individual or family in actual financial need and assisting with the Social/Government and/or the Masonic Financial Need Application Process. Many people do not know about all the services available through Government and Social Agencies that they may qualify for.

The needs of Masonic widows, families of deceased brethren, members in advanced years who may be incapacitated or confined to home must be of particular concern to each lodge. The happiness of benevolence is in action but its test is what one is willing to do for others.
